

Sagamore Council Contingent to the BSA Centennial Jamboree – July 22 – August 6, 2010

Statistics



- Over 43,000 Scouts and Leaders will attend.
- Located at the 76,000 acre Ft. A.P. Hill in Virginia
- Plans in place for 18,000 tents and 3,600 patrol kitchens.
- Our jamboree troop is made up of 4 adults and 36 youth, consisting of 4 patrols of 8 scouts, and 4 youth leaders (senior patrol leader, assistant senior patrol leader, quartermaster and scribe) selected from various units in Sagamore council.

Activities

- Adventure activities include scuba, kayaking, rafting, archery, shooting, zip line, COPE, mountain biking, motocross, mountain boarding, racing shells, rappelling, and countless other activities
- Demonstration/exhibition activities include U.S. Army and other armed services plus the FBI and other federal agencies all hands on and interactive
- Merit Badge Midway that includes a midway filled with close to a hundred booths offering dozens of different merit badges, many of which could be earned entirely on site – such as Engineering (staffed by Sagamore Council)
- Visit sites that recreate Brownsea Island (Baden-Powell's first scout camp), an American Indian Village, and an on-site Jambo radio station that you can DJ
- Arena shows include fireworks, laser light shows, rock bands and even a visit from the President of the United States



The Trip – 2 in 1

- 3 Days in Washington DC seeing the Nation's Capitol
- 10 days at Fort A.P. Hill with 42,999 of your closest friends
- All travel to and from, meals, lodging and activities in Washington, and lodging and activities at the Jamboree, and all troop gear included in trip cost
- Personal gear, full Scout uniforms, spending money for souvenirs and snacks are not included



Cost

- Total trip cost is going to be *approximately* \$1700
- Cost is based on the following: Jamboree cost is \$795, transportation \$400, Washington trip \$250, equipment/miscellaneous \$250
- The council committee is working to reduce the cost – but no guarantees
- Popcorn earnings from 2008 and 2009 can be banked for trip
- \$100 is due at sign up, payments of about \$500 due in mid 2009, late 2009 and early 2010

Registration

- Go to www.bsajamboree.org for an application – **deadline is January 1, 2009!!**
- Adults: print out application, fill out, attach scouting resume and submit to council office
- Youth: fill out application, print out and bring to your scoutmaster for his signature, submit to scout office with \$100
- Requirements for youth: - Between age 12 and 18 in July 2010, at least 1st class scout in July 2010, approval of Scoutmaster and council committee
- Requirements for SM and 1st ASM: – over 21, must have been SM for 1 year in 2007-2010, trained (incl. Woodbadge), approved by Council Committee
- Requirements for 2nd & 3rd ASM: – over 21 (3rd can be 18-21), trained, active leader in troop for 1 year 2007 – 2010, approval of council committee
